RABBI'S MESSAGE

The Finest of Habits; Asking for God's Will

"When You said, 'Seek My face,' my heart said to You, 'Your face, O Lord, I shall seek."

(Psalm 27:8)

Where does the will of G-d fit in Your Life? That is do you ask for His will, His direction, and His guidance? Or do you wake up in the morning without giving it a lot of thought and just move in the same track as you normally do and as long as you have what you need

and want? - you don't give G-d a whole lot of thought...
Once when I was sitting in on a meeting and people were discussing what to do with a challenging situation, the discussions went on with no satisfactory resolution since opinions were divided. When I suggested "well what would G-d's will be here?" I was met with silence.

The meeting continued in discussion and all pretended they never even heard the comment... Is not the will of G-d to affect everything we think, say and do? Is not the will of G-d our life purpose and be the principle which directs our life every single day? It doesn't make a difference who you are, but if you never ask G-d for direction or guidance in your life what you are saying about your conduct and attitude? Is it can do without Him; I don't need His direction, I don't need His help, I can make it without Him.

When you live day after day without consulting G-d saying "What's your will?" What pleases you? What honors you? If I live day after day without saying that - what I'm really saying is - I don't need him. What does your conduct say? Do you act like you need him day after day; G-d what do you say about this day? What would You have me do about this meeting? purchase? conversation? decision? relationship? - how I handle my money, how I handle people? If you go day after day and you don't ask for G-d's guidance and direction, you're saying "I can handle it" - How foolish, how foolish to think you

can handle life without G-d in the society in which you live. (Proverbs 1:7)

"You G-d lead me in paths of righteousness for Your namesake" (Psalm 23:3)

If someone asked you, "Do you do G-d's will?" what would your answer be? Would you be able to explain what Gd's will is? G-d's will is what G-d desires as the best for you in your life. This does not mean what's most comfortable, easy or obvious. He has a plan for your life, yet most people never stop to consider and ask G-d; Should I make this investment? Should I say yes to this decision? If you want G-d's best for your life, you make Him your priority. Sadly, most will never do this and hence we see the world as it is, full of chaos, strife, confusion, depression, drugs, oppressions, immoralities, unrest, murders and even wars. People are living without G-d and the substitutes are sex, drugs, alcohol, money and diversions to fill the voids they feel. You can't make enough money to be happy without G-d. Life is a serious business. The only way out is a personal relationship with G-d and that begins with seeking Him, asking Him, confiding in Him and asking to show Him His will for your life, for He is a good, loving, perfect G-d. When is the last time you asked - Lord, what is your will for my Life today? You're never too old to ask, Hashem What is your will for my life now?
